

Glory

1392. doxázō; fut. doxásō, from dóxa (**G1391**), glory. *To glorify. The consequential meaning from the opinion which one forms is to recognize, honor, praise, invest with dignity, give anyone esteem or honor by putting him into an honorable position.*

1391. dóxa; gen. dóxēs, fem. noun **from dokéō (G1380)**, to think, recognize. **Glory.**

A look at the root word of dóxa, i. e., dokéō (G1380), to think or suppose, is necessary. Etymologically, the word primarily means thought or opinion, especially favorable human opinion, and thus in a secondary sense reputation, praise, honor (true and false), splendor, light, perfection, rewards (temporal and eternal).

1380.o dokéō; contracted dokō, fut. dóxō, aor. édoxa. *To think, imagine, consider, appear. Expresses the subjective mental estimate or opinion formed by man concerning a matter.*

John 17

1 These words spoke Jesus, and lifted up his eyes to heaven, and said, Father, the hour is come; **glorify (g1392)** thy Son, that thy Son also may **glorify (g1392)** thee:

Philippians 2

9 Wherefore God also hath highly exalted him, and given him a name which is above every name:

10 That at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, of things in heaven, and things in earth, and things under the earth;

11 And that every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the **glory (g1391)** of God the Father.

2 As thou hast given him **power (g1849 – authority)** over all flesh, that he should give eternal life to as many as thou hast given him.

Hebrews 13

7 Remember them which have the rule over you, who have spoken unto you the word of God: whose faith follow, considering the end of their conversation.

17 Obey them that have the rule over you, and submit yourselves: for they watch for your souls, as they that must give account, that they may do it with joy, and not with grief: for that is unprofitable for you.

2 Corinthians 10

8 For though I should boast -- somewhat more of our **authority (g1849)**, which the Lord hath given us **for edification, and not for your destruction**, I should not be ashamed:

3 And this is life eternal, that they might **know (g1097 – Know by experience)** thee the only true God, and Jesus Christ, whom thou hast sent.

4 I have **glorified (g1392) thee** on the earth: I have finished the work which thou gave me to do.

Matthew 11

27 All things are delivered unto me of my Father: and **no man knows the Son**, but the Father; neither knows any man the Father, save the Son, and he to whomsoever the Son will reveal him.

Note: The Son Himself is never revealed. This is also stated in John 1:18.

5 And now, O Father, **glorify (g1392)** thou me with **thine own self** with the **glory (g1391)** which I had with thee before the world was.

Proverbs 30

4 Who hath ascended up into heaven, or descended? Who hath gathered the wind in his fists? Who hath bound the waters in a garment? Who hath established all the ends of the earth? **What is his name, and what is his son's name, if thou canst tell?**

Mark 12

35 And Jesus answered and said, while he taught in the temple, How say the scribes that Christ is the son of David?

36 For David himself said by the Holy Ghost, the Lord said to my Lord, Sit thou on my right hand, till I make thine enemies thy footstool.

37 David therefore himself calleth him Lord; and whence is he then his son? And the common people heard him gladly.

2 Thessalonians 2

14 Whereunto he called you by our gospel, to **the obtaining of the glory (g1391)** of our Lord Jesus Christ.
