*Leviticus 16*

*11 And Aaron shall bring the bullock of the sin offering, which is for himself, and shall make an atonement for himself, and for his house, and shall kill the bullock of the sin offering which is for himself:*

*12 And he shall take a censer full of burning coals of fire from off the altar before the Lord, and his hands full of sweet incense beaten small, and bring it within the veil:*

*13 And he shall put the incense upon the fire before the Lord, that the **cloud (h6051)** of the incense may cover the mercy seat that is upon the testimony, that he die not:*

*Leviticus 16*

*2 And the Lord said unto Moses, Speak unto Aaron thy brother, that he come not at all times into the holy place within the veil before the mercy seat, which is upon the ark; that he die not: for I will appear in the **cloud (h6051)** upon the mercy seat.*

ab: **Affliction:** The pictograph 𐤂 is a picture of the eye, the 𐤀 is a picture of a seed representing continuance. Combined these mean "eye of continuance". The nomadic agriculturist carefully watches over his livestock and crops by keeping a close eye on them. It was common to construct a shelter consisting of a roof on four posts, as a shelter from the glare of the sun. (eng: eye - with the removal of the n)

Revelation 8

1 And when he had opened **the seventh seal**, there was silence in heaven about the space of **half an hour**.

**The seventh seal is the fullness of confirmation or the revelation that you possess God's holy spirit.**

2 And I saw the seven angels which stood before God; and to them were given seven trumpets.

**An hour in the scriptures symbolizes an event. Half of an hour could equate to two events.**

Luke 22

52 Then Jesus said unto the chief priests, and captains of the temple, and the elders, which were come to him, *Be ye come out, as against a thief, with swords and staves?*

53 *When I was daily with you in the temple, ye stretched forth no hands against me: **but this is your hour**, and the power of darkness*

**The two events that take place in this hour are a cleansing of the 144,000 and a giving of the message of God's love.**

3 And **another angel** came and stood at the altar, having a golden censer; and there was given unto him much incense, that he should offer it with the prayers of all saints upon the golden altar which was before the throne.

**You have become another messenger, different from who you were before possessing God's spirit.**

4 And the smoke of the incense, which came with the prayers of the saints, ascended up before God out of the angel's hand.

5 And the angel took the censer, and filled it with fire of the altar, and cast it into the earth: and there were voices, and thundering, and lightning's, and an earthquake.

Isaiah 13

1 The burden of Babylon, which Isaiah the son of Amoz did see.

2 Lift ye up a banner upon the high mountain, exalt the voice unto them, shake the hand, that they may go into the gates of the **nobles (h5081 - willing)**.

3 I have commanded **my sanctified ones**, I have also called **my mighty ones** for mine anger, even **them that rejoice in my highness**.

4 The noise of a multitude in the mountains, like as of a great people; a tumultuous noise of the kingdoms of nations gathered together: the Lord of hosts mustered the host of the battle.

5 **They come from a far country, from the end of heaven, even the Lord, and the weapons of his indignation**, to destroy the whole land.

6 Howl ye; for the day of the Lord is at hand; it shall come **as a destruction from the Almighty**.

Jeremiah 1

9 Then the Lord put forth his hand, and touched my mouth. And the Lord said unto me, **Behold, I have put my words in thy mouth.**

10 See, I have this day set thee over the nations and over the kingdoms, **to root out, and to pull down, and to destroy, and to throw down, to build, and to plant.**

7 Therefore shall all hands be faint, and every man's heart shall melt:

8 And they shall be afraid: pangs and sorrows shall take hold of them; they shall be in pain as a woman that travails: they shall be amazed one at another; their faces shall be as flames.

9 Behold, the day of the Lord cometh, cruel both with wrath and fierce anger, to lay the land desolate: and he shall destroy the sinners thereof out of it.

10 **For the stars of heaven and the constellations thereof shall not give their light: the sun shall be darkened in his going forth, and the moon shall not cause her light to shine.**

**This must happen if a person is to receive truth and come out of the great apostasy!**

11 And I will **punish (h6485 - visit)** the world for their evil, and the wicked for their iniquity; and I will cause the arrogance of the proud to cease, and will lay low the haughtiness of the terrible.

12 I will make a man more precious (h3365 - rare) than fine gold; even a man than the golden wedge of Ophir.

13 Therefore **I will shake the heavens, and the earth shall remove out of her place**, in the wrath of the Lord of hosts, and in the day of his fierce anger.

Joel 3

**16 The Lord also shall roar out of Zion, and utter his voice from Jerusalem; and the heavens and the earth shall shake:** but the Lord will be the hope of his people, and the strength of the children of Israel.

14 And it shall be as the chased roe, and as a sheep that no man taketh up: they shall every man turn to his own people, and flee every one into his own land.

15 Every one that is found shall be thrust through; and every one that is joined unto them shall fall by the sword.

16 Their children also shall be dashed to pieces before their eyes; their houses shall be spoiled, and their wives ravished.

11 Make bright the arrows; gather the shields: the Lord hath raised up **the spirit of the kings of the Medes: for his device is against Babylon**, to destroy it; because it is the vengeance of the Lord, the vengeance of his temple.

18 Their bows also shall dash the young men to pieces; and they shall have **no pity on the fruit of the womb; their eye shall not spare children.**

19 And Babylon, the glory of kingdoms, the beauty of the Chaldees' excellency, **shall be as when God overthrew Sodom and Gomorrah.**

20 It shall never be inhabited, neither shall it be dwelt in from generation to generation: neither shall the Arabian pitch tent there; neither shall the shepherds make their fold there.

21 But wild beasts of the desert shall lie there; and their houses shall be full of doleful creatures; and owls shall dwell there, and satyrs shall dance there.

22 And the wild beasts of the islands shall cry in their desolate houses, and dragons in their pleasant palaces: and her time is near to come, and her days shall not be prolonged.
