The Exodus from Egypt took place on the fifth day of the week, on what we call Thursday. (*Legends of the Jews*, Louis Ginzberg, Vol. 3, 12.) Moses had repeatedly told Pharaoh that he should let the Hebrew people go for they were to travel for three days' journey into the wilderness to worship their God and make offerings to their God. Exodus 3:18, 5:3, 8:27, and 15:22.
