Revelation 8

3 And another angel came and stood at the altar, having a golden censer; and there was given unto him much incense, that he should offer it with the prayers of all saints upon the golden altar which was before the throne.

4 And the smoke of the incense, which came with the prayers of the saints, ascended up before God **out of the angel's hand.**

Without people being in our lives we will never see our weaknesses. We know to walk in love as the Father is love. We know to look at the world through His eyes. When we fail we are seeing the symptoms of our true problems. Allowing Him to show us the problems gives us the incense needed to add to our prayers for deliverance.

The seven churches of Revelation chapters 2 and 3 describe mindsets we have had before coming to possess God's holy spirit. The problems these churches have cannot be corrected without the power of the spirit. Therefore, we will continue to manifest these things until we allow God to reveal the depth of the problems that they might be consumed in the fire found only on the altar of incense.

Ephesus

(Given to Smyrna) Revelation 2:9 I know thy works, and tribulation, and poverty, (but thou art rich)...

The message to Ephesus contains the answer to most any problem we have. New Jerusalem is the mindset of God and we enter back into our first love by following the beatitudes of Matthew 5:1-9. We must approach our problems being poor in spirit and mourning because of the symptoms we see manifest in our actions and attitudes.

All of the symptoms begin to be seen when we try to serve God. We see there is more to deliverance than just praying the prayer and going to church.

*((Given to Sardis) Revelation 3:1 And unto the angel of the church in Sardis write; These things saith he that hath the seven Spirits of God, and the seven stars; I know thy works, **that thou hast a name that thou livest, and art dead.***

Revelation 2

14 But I have a few things against thee, because thou hast there them that hold the doctrine of Balaam, who taught Balac to cast a stumblingblock before the children of Israel, to eat things sacrificed unto idols, and to commit fornication.

To put this inward: The children of Israel = the truths God has given us

Balac = King of the Moabites or our unwillingness to change

We eat things sacrificed to idols that we may continue following our own desires.
